All candidate bios will be posted to the chapter website. USGBC - Nevada Chapter elections utilize proportional voting, similar to USGBC national. Registered chapter members will be able cast one vote per open seat. All votes of individuals from any one member company or organization will be tallied as equal percentages totaling one vote per company. For example, if there are 10 local chapter members who work at the same company, each of their votes will count as 10% of the final vote counted from their company.
